Director's Report September 2022

Meetings with Commissioners and FY23 Budget- Barb and I met with Jerry and Brent to discuss the FY23 Budget. The FY23 Budget numbers that the commissioners had matched with the numbers submitted by the library. The final budget hearing was August 31, and the final budget was voted on September 7.

Staffing- Kathryn and Donna are full-time in Libby, restoring the Libby branch to full staffing levels. Lucy needed to take an extended leave to take care of family. Libby staff have been covering as needed in Troy.

Libby Hours- New hours at the Libby branch began September 6.

Library Journal Design Institute in Missoula- Sharee and I are attending the LJ Design Institute in Missoula on September 29. The Troy Library and Opportunity Center project was selected for a Design Challenge. Sharee and I met with architects from NoII + Tam Architects to talk about our vision for the project, and how we would like to present the design challenge.

Grants- Sharee and I worked on the Final Report for the Montana Healthcare Grant. I submitted an application for the Lincoln County Community Foundation to fund Imagination Library. The Dotted i completed the grant research process. I will review the suggestions and prioritize grants to apply for.

Advancing Access for Library Customers with Sensory Needs- Sharee took a training on providing services to patrons with sensory needs. We are looking at expanding the training to all staff; however, the company that provides the best training is more expensive than we would like.

Step into Computer Class- Job Service held a 3-part computer course at the Troy branch. The same course was offered at the Eureka branch, but unfortunately, no one signed up for this round.

TLOC: Request for Proposals- We completed an RFP cycle and interviewed 4 architectural firms interested in drafting a Preliminary Architectural Report for TLOC. Sharee and I have decided to move forward with Mosiac Architecture. We will make a formal announcement when the contract is signed.

Tech Help- Ethan has been offering Tech Help Tuesdays in Libby and Thursdays alternating Troy and Eureka.
